With Nathan Goodman and Pradyot Sharma, George Mason University. “Polycentric governance in a vulnerable world.” We examine the authoritarian political implications of the Fermi paradox and potential civilization ending events, modeling the outcomes of both monocentric and polycentric governance approaches.

With Roberto Alas, University of Houston. “Populism and Party Institutionalization: Bottom up values, top down process?” We perform a cross-national analysis of the effect of the New Populism on party institutionalization and the implications for the quality of democratic governance.

“Semi-supervised Machine Learning for Measuring Populist and Ideological Rhetoric in Opaque Societies.” Creates a measure of populism using a Latent Semantic Scaling model on a corpus of UN General Assembly speeches, validated against existing measures and alternate models.
